The British Land National Ski Championships

16-21 March at Tignes, France

L&SERSA skiers showed the way once again in the National Ski Championships. Chemmy Alcott easily retained her overall title (Victor Ludorum), whilst Katrina Head picked up 2 trophies for "Best placed British Lady not in the British Team" and the "Most Promising Lady Skier" of the race. Ed Drake (17) was presented with the Spence Trophy for British Under 18 Male Champion. Chemmy Alcott led a clean sweep of the podium places for L&SERSA in the Ladies' Senior Downhill with Joanne Greig second and Katrina Head third. Katrina also won the Cup for the best placed Briton not in the British Team. Katrina Head was crowned Junior champion in the Ladies Junior Downhill race run immediately afterwards on the same course. Jamie Miles was placed third overall in the Men's Junior Downhill.

In the Super-G there was a repeat of the Downhill results with Chemmy Alcott, Joanne Greig and Katrina Head again filling the first three places. Johnny Moulder-Brown was third in the Men's race.

In the Giant Slalom L&SERSA skiers were triumphant yet again. Chemmy Alcott claimed the top step of the Ladies' podium and Katrina Head went one better than her previous races and finished second. Katrina again won the Cup for the best placed Briton not in the British Team. Johnny Moulder-Brown finished ahead of the rest of the British Team to take first place in the Men's race.

In the Slalom the top step of the Ladies' podium again belonged to Chemmy Alcott with Joanne Greig in second spot. Johnny Moulder-Brown finished third in the Men's race behind the Baxter brothers. Marc Telling (19) came back after a bout of illness to claim Third Junior place in the Mens Slalom whilst Ed Drake won another Cup for the best placed Briton under the age of 18.
