Charlotte Evans managed a great 2nd place overall only missing the top spot by 2 points. Amongst the males, Thomas Kirton and David Askew managed 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively in the CH1 category whilst Nick Robinson missed 1<sup>st</sup> place by only 3 points in the CH2 group. Lloyd Papantoniou took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Junior 1 category, only 4 points behind the winner, after competing in only 3 three races. In the Masters category Dave Blackwell came 1<sup>st</sup>. good to see Dave back skiing again after a few years absence.

Both the Club National and the European Championships held at Wycombe Summit on July 16/17<sup>th</sup> were eventful for LSERSA races. On the Saturday in the sweltering heat Max Moss, Charlotte Evans and Alessia Thomas-Jackson managed to take 1st place in their age group categories. Anouska Callander managed a 2nd place in her age group (JN2) which also gave her 3rd place overall. Others with podium positions included Eleanor Steward 3rd Mini, Christina Pennock 3rd JN2, Stacey Luck 3rd JN1, Emily Evans 2nd CH1, Charlotte Jesse 3rd CH1, Kirsty Stevens 2nd SEN Sarah Thornton 3rd SEN Amongst the men Marc Telling took 3rd place overall (2nd SEN), Dan Curtis managed a 1st CH2, whilst Dave Askew came 2nd CH1, Oliver Robinson 3rd JN2 and Zak Jesse 3rd CH1. In the European Championships as well as England teams coming 1st and 3<sup>rd</sup> with help from several LSERSA skiers in the teams individual skiers both men and women did well. Anouska Callander and Charlotte Evans came 2nd and

3rd overall whilst Marc Telling and Oliver Robinson took the same positions in the mens competition.

Other honours were taken by the following girls, Kathryn Barber 3rd JN1, Christina Pennock 2 JN2, Emily Evans 1st CH1, Charlotte Jesse 2nd CH1 and Kirsty Stevens 2nd SEN. In the mens races Daniel Curtis took 2nd CH2, David Askew 1st CH1 and Peter Davies 3rd CH1. In the Masters category Marcus Perner (AUS) was difficult to catch but we did well with Paul Bunton and James Gambrill taking 2nd and 3rd places.
