Race Bulletin No. 1 and Acceptance List



Organisation

The championships are organised by Wycombe Summit Ltd on behalf of the English Ski Council. The Wycombe International Championships is a seeded race.

The race will consist of a special slalom in the morning (run in accordance with ESC Grand Prix rules, i.e. 2 courses), followed by a team parallel slalom. The team parallel slalom will be for children, juniors and seniors.

Entry Criteria

The race will consist of a special slalom run in accordance with ESC Grand Prix rules, i.e. 2 courses, and is open to Foreign racers and registered racers of the Home Nations in the following categories: Children I, Children II, Junior I, Junior II, and Seniors. Racers with low seed points are given priority over those with high seed points.

Any registered racer can enter but if the race is oversubscribed a seed point cut off will be implemented.

Any entries received and accepted after the closing date will be subject to an additional fee of £5.00.

Every attempt will be made to keep to the above schedule. The organisers reserve the right to amend the programme as necessary. Please check the race notice board on arrival and listen out for announcements over the PA system.

Race Rules

The race will be run under FIS rules as varied by the ESC. Gloves and long sleeves must be worn at all times whilst on the slope, including during open practice, course inspection and the race itself. Racers are reminded of the regulations requiring the use of protective 'bungs' or caps on ski pole tips, of the regulations governing the limits on ski binding height. These regulations are liable to be enforced during this event.

For this Race whilst skiing through the poles all competitors and forerunners must wear head protection complying with BS EN1385 or equivalent.

The Start Referee has the right to refuse a racer starting if the racer does not appear on time. The Start Referee will be instructed to work to FIS 613.6.

If time allows, racers who are DISQ. or DNF. 1st run will be given a second run, however their times will not be recorded on the results.

The parallel slalom relays will be run in accordance with the E.S.C. race manual - Pages 7 - 1 to 7 - 6 and will consist of one run per round and the final being decided in the best of three runs. Any team having a bye in the first round, will be allowed one training run down one course only, before the competition starts - therefore no byes will be skied. No competitor may race for more than one team in a given day.

Course Inspection

The course must be inspected wearing skis, and bibs numbers must be visible throughout course inspection. No one is allowed to ski the course during inspection. Race trainers/coaches may accompany their racers and do not now need to wear skis. Please enter the slope from either the top or bottom. Course inspection may start from any point on the course.

Team Parallel Slalom - International Championships

A team will consist of six racers from the Children, Junior and Senior categories, at least two of whom must be from the opposite sex. Each team will be seeded from the results of the day's special slalom. A single entry will be accepted from each of the Home Nations and other national teams present to a maximum of 16. In the event of fewer than 8 entries being received, a second entry may be accepted from each nation to a maximum of 8 teams.

A substitution may be accepted by the jury on the basis of injury, or from an overseas team being unable to achieve the minimum number of team members.

Acceptance

The jury used ESC seed list 2002.5 to determine the acceptance list. At the first jury meeting, held on Saturday 19th April 2003, the jury considered 126 entries (43 female and 83 male). The following were not accepted due to no seed points Female racers Kathryn Barber and Natalia Harte and also male racers Gerard Flahive, Fergus Fraser-Hafter, Remy Holmes, Alexander Jeal, James Paxton and

Daniel Smith. NB. Subject to the race being under subscribed and the organisers agreement, recent results, including a Club National race held the day before can be considered for entry criteria.

The jury has agreed to leave the race open to receive late entries by first post on Wednesday 30th April 2003 or until the total race limit of 200 is received, if sooner.

Entries from racers with a note by their name on the enclosed start list were provisionally accepted, and must see the Race Secretary on race day to validate their entry prior to collecting their bib. Notes are as follows:

S requires the entry form to be signed.

P requires payment / payment adjustment of £14.00 race entry fee.

R requires proof of registration.

Protests, and late entry acceptance confirmation

The Race Secretary must receive protests against non-acceptance of entries in writing by 1st post Wednesday 30th April 2003. Results of protests, and confirmation of acceptance of late entries may be obtained by phoning the Race Secretary Sally Woods on 01634 362174 between 8pm and 9pm on Thursday 1st May 2003.

Race Office and Notice Board

The race office will be located at the Wycombe Summit Ski Centre at all times. The official race notice board will be located on the balcony outside the Restaurant at the Ski Centre.

Commentator sheets and race bibs

Commentator sheets must be completed and handed in when collecting a race bib. Race bibs must be returned to the Finish Marshall on completion of the final run, and failure to do so will result in a charge of £25 for each missing bib.

Referee's Report Protests

Referee's Report protests must be made in writing on official forms, which will be available at the race office. These must be completed and handed in within the set time limit, and accompanied by a fee of £25. Video evidence must be provided.

Open Practice

Wycombe Summit Ski Centre will be open for open practice from 10.00am to 22.00 hours on Friday 2nd May 2003 and until 18.00 hours on Saturday 3rd May 2003. Prices are £9.50 for the session.

First Aid

Wycombe Summit Ski Centre Staff will supply First Aid.

Dope Testing

Dope testing may take place at this event.

Regulations

Racers are reminded of the following:

1. Ski Poles with a tip diameter of less than 15mm must be fitted with suitable tip protectors to increase the tip diameter to 15 mm.
2. Bad Language – TD's have been instructed to apply the unsportsmanlike behavior rule to any racer using bad language. This will result in sanctions ultimately leading to bans for repeated offenders.
3. Ski Binding Heights, Children 1 - 45mm Max, Children 2 - 50mm Max, Junior / Seniors 55mm Max.
4. **For this Race whilst skiing through the poles all competitors and forerunners must wear head protection complying with BS EN1385 or equivalent.**
5. Start Licenses may be checked.
6. All racers are advised to read the revised ROTP race manual- a copy can be found on Peter Heath's web site (britski.org).

Refunds

Following acceptance into the race, refunds of £10 will only be given to racers on production of a medical certificate.

Insurance

The Slope and the event are covered for Public Liability Insurance and all registered racers are covered by their national schemes.

Officials

Please note these races can only run with sufficient race officials. If you are able to assist please contact the Chief of Race.

Accommodation

We are offering free accommodation for the international team members plus up to 2 Team Managers on the Saturday evening. All meals are excluded.
