Organisation

The championships are organised by Wycombe Summit Ltd on behalf of the Snowsport England. The Wycombe International Championships is eligible for consideration as a seeded race.

The race will consist of a special slalom in the morning (run in accordance with Snowsport England Grand Prix rules, i.e. 2 courses), followed by a team parallel slalom. The team parallel slalom will be for children, juniors and seniors.

Entry Criteria

The International race will consist of a special slalom run in accordance with Snowsport England Grand Prix rules, i.e. 2 courses, and is open to foreign racers and registered racers of the home nations in the following categories: Children I, Children II, Junior I, Junior II, Seniors and Masters. Home nation racers will be subject to a 250 seed point cut off

The Minis race follows the same format, and is open to registered racers born in 1994-1997.

Every attempt will be made to keep to the above schedule. The organisers reserve the right to amend the programme as necessary. Please check the race notice board on arrival and listen out for announcements over the PA system.

Race Rules

The race will be run under FIS rules as varied by Snowsport England. Gloves and long sleeves must be worn at all times whilst on the slope, including during open practice, course inspection and the race itself.

Racers must be ready to start when the racer in front finishes. Racers who are not ready to start on time risk disqualification. The Start Referee will be instructed to work to FIS 613.6.

If time allows, racers who are DISQ. or DNF. 1st run will be given a second run.

The parallel slalom relays will be run in accordance with Snowsport England race manual articles 1100 – 1119.8 and will consist of one run per round and the final being decided in the best of three runs. Any team having a bye in the first round, will be allowed one training run down one course only, before the competition starts – there after no byes will be skied. No competitor may race for more than one team in a given day.

Course Inspection

The course must be inspected wearing skis, and bibs numbers must be visible throughout course inspection. No one is allowed to ski the course during inspection. Race trainers/coaches may accompany their racers and do not need to wear skis. Course inspection may start from any point on the course.

Team Parallel Slalom -International Championships

A team will consist of six racers from the Children, Junior and Senior categories, at least two of whom must be from the opposite gender. Each team will be seeded from the results of the day's special slalom. A single entry will be accepted from each of the Home Nations and other national teams present to a maximum of 16. In the event of fewer than 8 entries being received, a second entry may be accepted from each nation to a maximum of 8 teams.

A substitution may be accepted by the jury on the basis of injury, or from an overseas team being unable to achieve the minimum number of team members.

This will be held in the Ski Lodge on Sunday 30th May 2004 – 08.15 hours

Prizes

Awards for the International Championships special slalom event will be made to both Female and Male racers as shown in the table below. In the Parallel slalom, prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd positioned teams.

Acceptance

The Jury used Snowsport England seed list 2004.1 to determine the acceptance list. At the first jury meeting, held on Sunday 16th May 2004, the jury considered 107 entries (3 Girls, 9 Boys 41 females and 54 males) and all were accepted into the race with the exception of following, female racers Stephanie Gibb, Rebecca Masterman, Jordon Moss and male racers Thomas Kirton, Paul Masterman, Mark Ratnage and Gareth Webster, who were not accepted due not meeting seed point cut off. NB. Subject to the race being under subscribed and the organisers agreement, recent results, including a Club National race held the day before may be considered for entry criteria.

The Jury has agreed to leave the race open to receive late entries by 17.00 on Wednesday 26th May 2004 or until the total race limit of 180 is received, if sooner.

The start list will be drawn on Wednesday 26th May 2004 in seed point order using Snowsport England seed list 2004.1 with the top 15 males and females being drawn for start order.

The race organisation propose to enter into the start list, top 15, one racer from each of the foreign nations, then enter the remaining foreign nation racers at regular intervals through out the start list.

Entries from racers with a note by their name on the enclosed start list were provisionally accepted, and must see the Race Secretary on race day to validate their entry prior to collecting their bib. Notes are as follows:

S requires the entry form to be signed.

P requires payment / payment adjustment of £14.00 race entry fee.

R requires proof of registration.

Protests, and late entry acceptance confirmation

The Race Secretary must receive protests against non-acceptance of entries in writing by 17.00 hrs Wednesday 26th May 2004. Results of protests, and confirmation of acceptance of late entries may be obtained by phoning the Race Secretary Sally Woods on 01634 362174 between 8pm and 9pm on Thursday 27th May 2004.

Race Office and Notice Board

The race office will be located at the Wycombe Summit Ski Centre at all times. The official race notice board will be located on the balcony outside the Restaurant at the Ski Centre.

Commentator sheets and race bibs

Commentator sheets must be completed and handed in when collecting a race bib. Race bibs must be returned to the Finish Marshall on completion of the final run, and failure to do so will result in a charge of £25 for each missing bib.

Referee's Report Protests

Referee's Report protests must be made in writing on official forms, which will be available at the race office. These must be completed and handed in within the set time limit, and accompanied by a fee of £25.

Open Practice

Wycombe Summit Ski Centre will be open for open practice from 10.00am to 22.00 hours on Friday 28th May 2004 and until 18.00 hours on Saturday 29th May 2004. Prices are £10.50 for the session.

First Aid

Wycombe Summit Ski Centre Staff will supply First Aid.

Regulations

Racers are reminded of the following:

1. Ski Poles with a tip diameter of less than 15mm must be fitted with suitable tip protectors to increase the tip diameter to 15 mm.
2. Bad Language – TDs have been instructed to apply the unsportsmanlike behavior rule to any racer using bad language. This may result in sanctions ultimately leading to bans for repeated offenders.
3. Ski Binding Heights, Children - 50mm Max, Junior / Seniors 55mm Max.
4. For this race, whilst skiing through the poles all competitors and forerunners must wear head protection complying with BS EN1385 or equivalent.
5. Start Licenses may be checked.
6. All racers are advised to read the revised ROTP race manual
7. Dope testing may take place at this event

Refunds

Following acceptance into the race, refunds of £10 will only be given to racers on production of a medical certificate.

Insurance

The Slope and the event are covered for Public Liability Insurance and all registered racers are covered by their national schemes.

Officials

Please note these races can only run with sufficient race officials. If you are able to assist please contact the Chief of Race.

Accommodation

We are offering free accommodation for the international team members plus up to 2 Team Managers on the Saturday evening. All meals are excluded.

Unfortunately other parents, friends and extra team managers will have to pay for their own accommodation. We recommend the Travel Inn, which costs £45.95 per room per night. 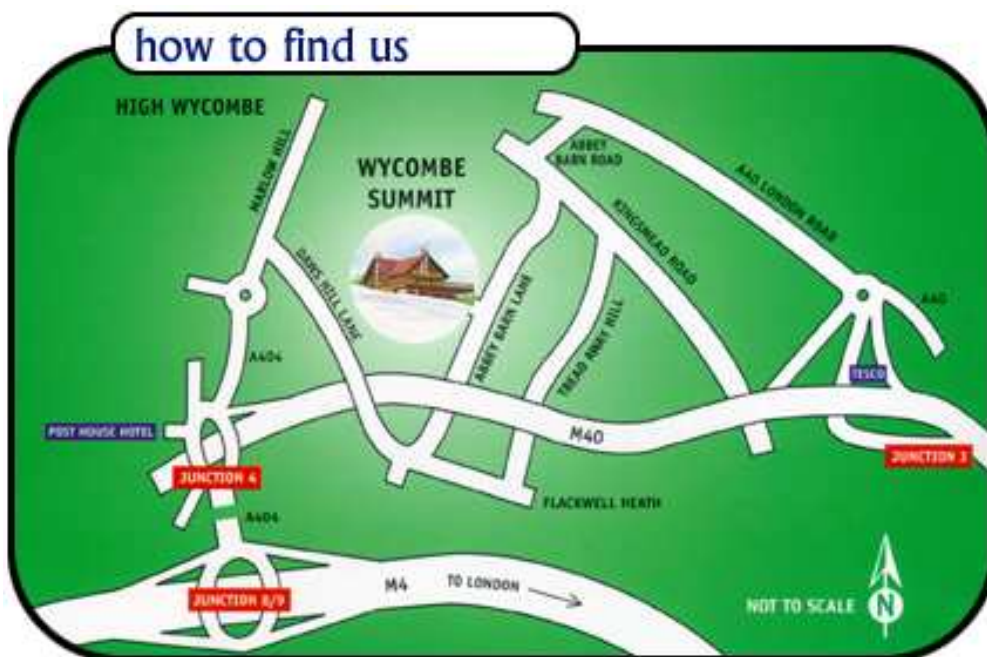
Directions to Slope

From Junction 3 of the M40

Via London - from the motorway slip road proceed to the 'Tesco' roundabout. Take the first exit on the left, signposted to Maidenhead and Flackwell Heath. At the next roundabout turn right (underneath motorway) signposted towards Flackwell Heath. At the next roundabout go straight on and immediately left into Kingsmead Road. Follow road for about 1 mile. As the road bears right around a sharp corner, turn left into Abbey Barn Lane. Continue up the hill and Wycombe Summit is on the right.

From Junction 4 of the M40

Via London or Oxford - take the slip road onto the large 'Cressex' roundabout. Take the A404 signposted to High Wycombe. As you leave the roundabout you will join a dual carriageway. Continue through traffic lights and follow High Wycombe signs around the next roundabout. As the road descends down towards High Wycombe town centre get into the right hand lane at the traffic lights. Turn right across the hill signposted Flackwell Heath and RAF Daws Hill. Follow this road (watch out for the speed camera) over the motorway bridge and after about 2 miles turn left into Abbey Barn Lane, signposted with brown tourist signs. Continue down this road, under the motorway, and Wycombe Summit is on the left.
